Speaker Biographies

Ruth S. Buzi, LCSW, PhD

*Assistant Professor and Social Services Coordinator
Baylor College of Medicine; Teen Health Clinic*

Dr. Ruth Solomon-Buzi at Baylor College of Medicine, currently supervises social workers at different clinic sites, as well as participates in grant writing, program development, and research on adolescents' health issues. She previously taught program evaluation and health policy at Graduate School of Social Work, University of Houston. Dr Solomon-Buzi also worked as a Social Services Manager for "AMIDAR" (Israel Housing Company) for several years and as a research associate in a program designed to evaluate the implementation of new interventions to address social needs of families and adolescents at the University of Haifa, Israel. Dr Solomon-Buzi also has worked in planning and implementing nurturing programs designed to increase the social and educational skills of children from low-income families.

Glenn Raup, PhD, RN, NE-BC

*Assistant Professor, DNP Program- Administration Track
Texas Christian University*

Dr. Glenn Raup, at Texas Christian University, is currently an Assistant Professor in the Harris College of Nursing and Health Science. He has published multiple papers on leadership, disaster and trauma management. Within his area of academic teaching and research he focuses on the education of new and experienced nursing administrators as well as assessment of nursing leadership style in middle and executive administrators and its impact on staff retention and patient satisfaction.

Prior to joining TCU, he was Senior Executive Director for Emergency and Trauma Services and in that capacity was responsible for the leadership and management of the John Peter Smith Hospital Emergency Department, Level II Trauma Center, Inmate Patient Admission unit, Chest Pain Unit as well as the hospital-based Urgent Care Center and held responsibility for the Correctional Health Service at 4 county jail facilities within Tarrant County. There were 8 direct reports with over 450 FTEs in the Emergency and Trauma service line. During that time, he implemented the first Emergency Department routine HIV screening program in the state of Texas in 2005. The program served as the anchor for a large-scale, system implementation that has now extended to over 40 clinics within the county healthcare system. The ED's routine HIV screening program was implemented as a service line, value-added program that has demonstrated both quality improvement and cost savings.

Ronald D. Wilcox, MD, FAAP

Program Director and Principal Investigator

Delta Region AIDS Education & Training Center

Dr. Wilcox is very active as a teaching faculty for the Louisiana LPS and is the administrative leader of the Regional AETC. Since Dr. Wilcox has assumed his current position with the AETC, special emphasis has been placed on outreach to minority providers and primary care providers and training of case managers to prepare them to function as medical case managers. In 2008 Dr. Wilcox received the federally-recognized AIDS Education & Training Center Award from HRSA for his work with HIV Education in LA, only the fifth person to receive this award. He has authored many articles and is the Executive Editor for the HIV Clinician periodical, produced by the Delta AETC Central Office. He is very involved with other parts of the Ryan White Programs, serving previously as the Vice Chairman of the New Orleans Planning Council (Part A) and currently the Chairperson for the New Orleans EMA Quality Improvement Committee and Medical Director for the FACES Program, the Part D program for Louisiana. Dr. Wilcox is also an Associate Professor of Internal Medicine and Pediatrics in the Section of Infectious Diseases and with the School of Public Health with the Louisiana State University Health Sciences Center in New Orleans.
